Your stories!

Libby's story about her experiences with CMN:

Hello my name is Libby and I am 7 years old - that's me on the right stood next to my twin sister Georgia. I live in Bristol with my Mum & Dad and older brother Mason. I was born with CMN which covered the back of my scalp. From birth I had lots of visits to Bristol Children's Hospital and then got referred to Great Ormond Street where we met Dr Kinsler. As Dr Kinsler knows all about this condition it was nice to listen to all the information she had and what could be done for me in the future.

At first, my condition was monitored to see how I lived day to day with CMN. The hardest part for me is that the CMN is really itchy, especially when I go to sleep. After being invited



back to see Dr. Kinsler, I had a biopsy from my scalp and leg to find out what type of CMN I have. When the results of the biopsy came back we had another appointment, this time with Mr Bulstrode, a Plastic Surgeon who specialises in the removal of CMN. He decided it was best for it to be removed, so in April 2015 we set off to London knowing I was going to be in hospital for a week after my operation. My operation went well and the CMN was removed. I had skin grafts taken from my thigh and positioned on my scalp. Nearly 2 years down the line I feel great, I have great confidence, I'm happy

and have no more discomfort.

My visits to Great Ormond Street Hospital were always made special because of the great doctors, nurses and staff who work there.

Do you know anyone who likes a challenge?

2017 brings the 20th anniversary of Caring Matters Now where there are plenty of opportunities to get involved in a fundraising event.
