
This new post at Great Ormond Street Hospital/Institute of Child Health in London is the first Fellowship to be endowed by Caring Matters Now, and is a major advance in funding ongoing research into CMN.

The post will be a full time position for three years for a PhD student, who will be supervised by Dr Kinsler, and starting in the first half of 2015. This will be the first project dedicated to looking at possible therapies for CMN, and the commitment and generosity of Caring Matters Now has been essential in getting this important research off the ground.

The partnership between the patient support group and the doctors/researchers continues to be a very powerful force in achieving results. The Fellow will report results back to Caring Matters Now on an annual basis, and present his or her results to the family day meetings, as well as to national and international conferences, to maximise the audience for the results.

2014 has been an epic year for fundraising and we would like to say a massive thank you to you all for doing your bit! But we must not rest on our laurels!


We have seen an increase in corporate support, schools fundraising and so many more individuals getting involved in one way or another.

Financial Review 2013/14

## So, as you know, Caring Matters Now is funded entirely by donations from individuals,

So, as you know, Caring Matters Now is funded entirely by donations from individuals groups and some grant giving trusts. The charity receives no Government funding.

The Annual Report and Accounts reviews performance for the past financial year is available to view on the website <a href="http://www.caringmattersnow.co.uk/about-us/annual-report/">http://www.caringmattersnow.co.uk/about-us/annual-report/</a>. The financial year is from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2013 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2014.

We are delighted to report that we achieved an income of over £83K of which £76K were donations in 2013. The majority (£48K) came from individuals. Other key events were the SKY Sports, Dancing with the Stars, CMN Sky Dive, 24 Peaks Challenge, Crabtree & Evelyn Events and Corporate/School fundraising events.

In 2013, we donated £26K on research at GOSH while £29K was spent on support campaigns (Support Days, Activity Weekend, Newsletters, Support Packs).








## **Financial History**

Here is an insight into our financial history since becoming registered in 2007.



2011 we peaked in donations due to the CMN Charity Challenge; Mt Kilimanjaro and then in 2013 with again the CMN Charity Challenge; 24 Peaks as well as other events as mentioned above.

Looking at the financial history and the income over expenses you will see year on year and that we peaked in 2010 with a net cash flow of £12,638, this then dipped over the following two years 2011 and 2012 with development projects such as the website, redesign and print of materials, new merchandise, introducing the activity weekend and developing the support days with the introduction of London (which increased costs). In addition we had the employment of a development officer/administrator.

But we are now seeing the fruits of our labour and our net cash flow is increasing again.

## Ethan's Story



On the 25<sup>th</sup> June 2012, our son Ethan was born and it was one of the happiest days our lives. Ethan was born with what only could be described as a birthmark/mole, which covered about 35% of his body, including the side of his face, his neck and shoulders.

When Ethan was born at York Hospital, the midwives and doctors had not seen anything like Ethan's condition before and we were referred to Newtondermatologist, Professor Bishop in Leeds. We were then referred to Dr Veronica Kinsler at Great Ormond Street Hospital in London and it was then that Ethan was diagnosed with Congenital Melanocytic Naevi (CMN). It was a great relief to be finally given some answers as to why our son was born with such an unusual skin condition.

Ethan was also under the care of Dr Thopte, a pediatrician at York hospital. Dr Thopte checked on Ethan's development regularly to make sure he was doing everything he was supposed to be. Ethan has now been discharged from York hospital as Dr Thopte has no concerns and is happy with Ethan's progress.

On Ethan's 1<sup>st</sup> birthday, we took him for an MRI scan to check his brain and spinal cord for abnormalities, which can cause neurological problems.

Thankfully Ethan's results came back all clear and both my partner Tom and I were over the moon. Yet we feel sad that some families do not get the same results as Ethan. It was after Ethan's MRI scan that Dr Veronica Kinsler told us about this amazing charity called "CARING MATTERS NOW" helps families who are affected by the same condition as Ethan's. Last year, we attended our first Caring Matters Now support day in Liverpool. We were, at first nervous to attend the support day, however we enjoyed it thoroughly and the day gave us so much more confidence. The support day allowed us to discuss our worries and concerns and as a result, left the feeling of isolation behind us.

## Success in Raising Awareness!

Wow... where do I begin? This year we have seen a huge rise in CMN awareness across the UK. Amazingly, we have been featured on three mainstream national Television channels; Sky News, ITV and BBC.

In July our charity featured on Sky News and ITV 'This Morning' as a result of Caring Matters Now hosting the visit of a very special little boy from Columbia. Didier, who featured in the channel 4 'Turtle Boy' documentary in 2011, had 6 full days experiencing the sights of London, meeting children affected by CMN for the very first time, taking part in the CMN research at Great Ormond Street Hospital and being featured on national television. The coverage we received on Sky News and ITV 'This Morning' was excellent. Both interviews explained what CMN is, the importance of CMN research and how Caring Matters Now supports those affected by CMN. Along with Didier and Jodi, Dr Kinsler was interviewed about her CMN research work on Sky News. As a result, our Caring Matters Now website received over 3,000 hits in the 24 hours after the interviews were aired.











Later on this year, we received a telephone call from BBC Children in Need asking if they could feature Caring Matters Now on BBC The One Show. We were thrilled to be asked to be featured on The One Show, as the TV programme has over 5 million viewers each evening.

The crew and presenter, Alex Jones, came along to our Liverpool Support Day in November and interviewed our CMN members, including Holly's parents Jon and The editorial team produced an excellent feature, which Donna McCrossan. highlighted the need for CMN support and research.
